As a post-secondary institution within the School District of Lee County, Cape Coral Technical College received a total of \$1.194 million in "institutional" funds through Higher Education Emergency Relief Funds (HEERF). These funds were used for major indoor air quality improvements and additional student aid distributions. Cape Tech also received \$917,000 in designated "Student Aid" HEERF funds that have been fully distributed to students over the past two years.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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These funds will help establish new skilled-trades workforce development programs that are not currently offered in the City of Cape Coral. The goal of campus expansion is to add capacity for at least 200 additional graduates per year who are ready to join the local workforce in high-demand industries.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funds will be used to establish site plans and building designs through architectural and engineering services. This is a required first step toward campus expansion for Cape Coral Technical College, the only college in a city of more than 200,000 residents.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Funding will be used to help establish new workforce development programs that will provide affordable, high-wage "career in a year" public workforce education options for the citizens of Southwest Florida.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is citizens looking to upskill or reskill in order to achieve a career in a high-wage trades profession. This includes high school students, college students, unemployed citizens, economically disadvantaged persons, and career changers. New programs will provide additional capacity for approximately 200 career certification graduates per year.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Progress toward the goal of 200 career certification graduates and placement in jobs in fields related to their programs will be measured annually. Cape Coral Technical College is required to track, maintain detailed documentation of, and report student completion, placement, and licensure data by the Council on Occupational Education (accrediting agency). Data are also reported to the state annually for operational purposes.
