14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This funding will enable Florida's network of 15 Centers for Independent Living (CILs) to provide community support coordination for adults with disabilities transitioning from hospitals, nursing homes and other institutional settings to the community. CILs will also provide counseling and independent living planning to students with disabilities transitioning from high school to post-secondary education or employment.

CILs will provide case management, employment skills training, peer support, assistance with securing accessible housing, assistive technology and other services to allow adults with disabilities to live, learn, work and succeed in their communities.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Community Transition services: Center for Independent Living staff will work with individuals with disabilities to help them transition from institutional settings, such as nursing homes, hospital, or correctional settings back to the community.

School Transition services: Students with disabilities transitioning from high school to post-secondary education or employment will receive counseling, peer supports, assistance with developing and achieving their education and employment goals.

Diversion Services: Centers for Independent Living will provide services and supports to prevent individuals with disabilities from being unnecessarily placed in a more restrictive settings.

Emergency/Disaster Response: Centers for Independent Living will work with individuals with disabilities who have been displaced due to a natural or man-made disaster to help them restore their independence and remain in their community.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Case management, peer mentoring, employment assistance, information about local services, assistance in enrolling in state assistance programs, development of Independent Living Plans, home modifications, assistance with acquiring assistive technology and durable medical equipment and accessing education and skills training and acquiring employment skills.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Floridians with disabilities of all ages and all disability types.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Adults with disabilities will receive assistance and support to live more independently in their communities, achieve their education and employment goals, and transition from institutional settings back to community living.

Outcomes from these services can be measured by the number of individuals who complete an Independent Living plan, the number of individuals who are diverted from an institutional placement and the number individuals who transition from institutional settings back to the community.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Minimum service hours will be stipulated in each contract. Failure to complete the stipulated service hours will result in reduced payment to the Center for Independent Living.
