a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune Center's mission is to foster three primary goals: 1) To provide a safe state of the art facility to house the archives of Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune; 2) To provide a space in which researchers, scholars, students and interested persons can study life of Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune, with the aim of promoting the values of Servant, Leadership, Self Reliance, Entrepreneurship, and Education; 3) To leverage tourism and economic development in Daytona Beach/Volusia County.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

These funds will be used for planning, due diligence, and program verification; schematic; design development; construction document; permitting; bid and GMP development; construction; and warranty inspections.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Educational and cultural enhancement activities will be provided to citizens from across the state. The direct services will be provided in the form of programming, educational visits with supplementary materials, unique and world class museum-style offerings, curricula, etc.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Over 10,000 individuals in the following communities are expected to be served: at-risk youth; grade school, high school, and postsecondary students, scholars, and researchers, tourists and citizens engaging in cultural/educational recreation, etc.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

1. Increase in cultural programming, events, and education: Prevalence of cultural events will be measured before Bethune Center programming, after six months, and after one year. 2. Improved knowledge of Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune and related subjects; improved outcomes in secondary school history and University African American studies courses: General knowledge of subject matter will be assessed before and after interaction with the Bethune Center; class grades and engagement will be measured before implementation and after the 2023-24 academic year. 3. Increase tourism by increasing education/professional and leisure travel to the Bethune Center in Daytona Beach, FL. The purpose of visits to Bethune Center will be assessed, including for scholarship, other professional purposes, or personal leisure.
