The specific goal of the project is to prevent bridge structure failure. Northern Way is a critical residential road for many residents in a very large community as well as other city residents that frequently pass through the area. After Hurricanes Ian and Nicole, a bridge inspection report noted significant safety issues including erosion of the approach slope and sidewalk washout damage caused by increased scour and erosion that occurred during the Hurricane Ian.
