The City of Bartow's (City) goal is to protect, save lives and property by designing and building a new fire rescue station on City-owned property that addresses growth in residential and commercial development. In a 2010 in a 3rd-party study, three new fire station locations were recommended to address population growth and the increase in square miles from 9 to 53. Increasing fire stations would improve response times, provide proper protection to save lives and property and improve insurance premiums and the ISO rating.

Activities and services will include contractual preliminary engineering, design, permitting bidding, project management, engineering during construction, land acquisition and construction services for a new Fire Rescue Station through the procurement policy and procedures.

Direct services will include faster and more efficient response to 911 emergency calls. Citizens will benefit with a new fire station because response times will improve; allows for efficient and effective public safety operations, improve emergency operations and improve insurance premiums and the ISO rating. The target population is the City of Bartow which serves as the County seat for Regional, Federal and State offices, agencies, properties and buildings, which are tax exempt creating a reduction of revenue that is needed to adequately serve its citizenry and surrounding communities. It is estimated more than 19,477 individuals are expected to be served.

Citizens will benefit with a new fire station because response times will improve; allows for efficient and effective public safety operations to include emergency operations and improve insurance premiums and the ISO rating.
