4. Project/Program Description

The City of Port Orange has an ongoing program to repair and replace aging stormwater infrastructure throughout the community. The City's stormwater pipes are mostly 40-50 year old corrugated metal and, in this coastal climate, they can fail causing voids in roadways and allow dirt into the stormwater system diminishing its effectiveness. The City has been lining or replacing approx. 1,000 linear feet of pipe each year. However, to help address the impacts of Hurricanes Ian and Nicole, the City needs to accelerate the program to make the stormwater system more resilient and requests state funds to help advance this effort.

This project will continue to line or replace aging corrugated metal stormwater pipelines to reduce flooding, damage to other infrastructure, and address potential water quality concerns.

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This funding will be utilized to continue stormwater rehabilitation by lining or replacing corrugated metal pipe. While the City has been proactive in replacing and lining the infrastructure, more resources need to be dedicated to this effort.

By completing pipelining or replacing corrugated metal pipe, the City is able to reduce failure of roadways and other infrastructure, reduce flooding, and improve stormwater conveyance. This is critical infrastructure for providing safe and reliable service to citizens.

The residents of Port Orange will be impacted by this project. There are an estimated 63,000+ residents in Port Orange as well as hundreds of businesses that serve a wider customer base throughout Port Orange, Volusia County, and beyond.

Success will be measured by the number of linear feet of pipe that is lined or replaced and reduced number of pipe failures.
