As an economically disadvantaged community it is Oak Hill's intention to partner with local government to assist in a process that will eliminate or resolve flooding and drainage problems through a tested methodology.

The elimination of stormwater and flooding will be resolved through an environmental process that is not a direct service to the population. However, the entire population will benefit from the completion of the process.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

General, more than 800.

Eliminate flooding in weather emergencies such as hurricanes, severe storms, and repeated rainfall. This outcome will be measured by the elimination of water being diverted to homes and stores at lower elevations as well as the elimination of road flooding.
